ISSUE: Stop Big Oil/Stop Enbridge

POTENTIAL CLIENTS: Stop Line 3, Honor the Earth, Oil & Water Don't Mix

SITUATIONAL ANALYSIS

A Canadian oil company, Enbridge, has a tar sands pipeline past its prime and desires to replace it. However, the pipeline has since become operational in October. In the past 47 years, Enbridge has spilled over nine million gallons of oil. They've had at least 927 leaks on their pipelines and 2 workers have died. These pipelines cause massive destruction to nature during construction and when spills occur. Despite being a Canadian company, Enbridge is responsible for the three largest land oil spills in U.S. history. They have defied stop work orders from state governors and operators have violated policies during oil spill disasters. The spills negatively affect Native and Indiegnous communities.

KEY ELEMENTS

The main focus of the campaign is the tradegies Enbridge has done and have barely own up to. They are still one of Canada's largest employers and still focus on oil and natural gas energy sources, than clean sources. Enbridge cares more about profit than people at the end of the day.

TARGET AUDIENCE

This campaign would target people who do not know about the issues surrounding the pipeline and indigenous peoples and people who are misinformed about the pipeline. It would also target those who want to learn more about the issue.

OBJECTIVE

To create a campaign that drives the message of the organization home in an impactful way that makes people think.

The tone will be serious, it shouldn't hold any punches. The topics are serious and the spills and disasters are nothing to joke about. The tone matches the content.



Enbridge is a Canadian oil company based out of Calgary, Alberta. They mainly focus on crude oil and natural gas pipelines. They have the longest pipeline system in North America. Currently, Enbridge has **8,672 mi (13,833 km)** of pipeline in the US and **8,500 mi (13, 681 km)** in Canada. These pipelines mainly transport tar sands and crude oil, the dirtest oil there is. Enbridge also has **23,850 mi (38,735 km)** of natural gas pipelines across five of Canada's provinces, 30 U.S. states, and the Gulf of Mexico. They have minimal clean energy sources or options for residents, though they have a proposal for net zero greenhouse emissions by 2050. They are also responsible the three largest land oil spils in U.S. history. **1973: 1.3 million gallons. 1991: 1.7 million gallons. 2010: one million gallons.**

Recently, Enbridge was in the news for the replacement of its Line 3 pipeline that runs from Hardisty, Alberta to Superior, Wisconsin. It was built in 1968 and is the pipeline that caused the two largest land oil spills. On its own, Line 3 has spilled over **5.7 million gallons of oil.** In recent years, due to infrastructure fears and aging pipes, Enbridge chose to replace the line in its entirety. Native communities disliked this decision, especially the Anishinaabeg and tribes in Minnesota (where the two spills happened.) The project was proposed around 2014 and was completed in October 2021, despite heavy protests surrounding it. In the end, Line 3 was replaced and was renamed Line 93, showing it was never a true replacement. The pipes are bigger and it can carry more oil than it ever did before. In Michigan, the state for the 2010 spill, some residents didn't know a pipeline ran through their state until Line 6B ruptured and spilled into the Kalamazoo River. In 2021, Governor Whitmer issued a stop work order to Enbridge to stop work on Line 5 by May 12th, 2021. The line ran under the Straits of Mackinac and many feared another spill for the fragile waterway. Enbridge defied the order and has been operating illegally for over **150 days.** From 1973 to 2013, there were **38 accounts** of leaks and spills, the spills accounting for nearly nine million gallons that were spilled.

There is not much information about the 1973 spill from Line 3. All that was able to be found were the basics. It was near Argyle, Minnesota and **1.3 million gallons** were spilled. It's the second-worst spill in U.S. history, at the time, it was the worst. There is little information about Enbridge spills before the 1990s. This is all I could find.

On March 10, 1991, Line 3 ruptured near Grand Rapids, Minnesota in the early morning. A geyser was caused, spraying oil 30-40 feet into the air coating trees in the area. In hours, oil spread through a wetland area near the rupture. Changes in the oil pressure weren't noticed by Enbridge operators in Alberta until over a quarter past noon. They chose to first increase pressure near the end of the line and then, in violation of policy, finally shut the line down 71 minutes after the pressure drop. By then, oil had spread into the Prairie River, a tributary of the Mississippi River. The Mississippi River was two miles downstream from the spill. In total, **1.7 million gallons** of oil were spilled. 300 people were evacuated from nearby residences. Clean-up took months and it was lucky that the Prairie River was frozen over - otherwise, the entire Mississippi River would have been affected. In 2004, near the same site, Line 3 spilled again, this time totaling **42,000 gallons**.

To many, including Enbridge, this is one of their greatest failures. It is the only spill listed on their accountability webpage. In Marshall, Michigan, Enbridge's Line 6B ruptured on July 25, 2010. The break was a six-foot gash in a 40-foot pipe segment and caused **one million gallons** in total to spill into the Kalamazoo River. Alarms rang in the Edmonton headquarters, however, control staff couldn't interpret them and were unaware of the breach until 18 hours after when a Michigan utility worker reported spilled oil. Operators had shut down the pipeline, but they thought the alarms were a bubble and had restarted the pipeline two separate times. The spill was contained to a 25 mile stretch of the Kalamazoo River. The clean-up was expected to take a while. 30 to 50 households were evacuated and twice more were advised to not drink their water due to oil contamination. In total, clean-up took five years. A year after the initial spill, the 25-mile stretch grew to 35 miles. Near the end of 2014, clean-up costs had risen to \$1.2 billion. In 2012, Enbridge was fined by USDOT **3.7 million dollars** and by July 2016, they agreed to pay **177 million dollars** in penalties and improvements. Since then, the entirety of Line 6B has been replaced and renamed Line 78. Metal from the original line has been transformed into steel rings for employees to wear to remind them of this catastrophic failure. This spill garnered the most media attention. Some Michigan residents didn't know a major pipeline even went through the state. It wasn't a concern for them. After the Kalamazoo disaster, residents found out that Line 5 was under the Straits of Mackinac and pushed officials to target Enbridge. The state government listened, but Enbridge didn't; Line 5 is currently operating illegally.

Enbridge is not a good company. They shouldn't be building pipelines in the United States or even Canada. Their pipelines have divided Native lands, offering some tribes **as little as \$1,500 in compensation.** Enbridge has had 28 spills from 2016-2019 according to their 2019 safety report. In 2020, there were seven reportable spills, spilling 943 barrels or around 37,720 gallons of oil - in one year. From 2011 to 2015, they spilled around 20,088 barrels, amounting to 803,520 gallons. There has also been at least **927 leaks** on their pipe;ines. In total, Enbridge has spilled, from 1973 to 2019, around **9,599,290 gallons of oil** or reportable liquids. For those worried about barrel amount, that's around **239,982 oil barrels.**



font choices

For this campaign, I wanted a fontface that was authorative and firm. There should be minimal loops, squared terminals, geometric shapes, and a slight contrast to the thicks and thins of the type. In particular, I was looking at fonts where the 'g' was a standard sans-serif 'g', not a binocular one seen in more grotesk and humanist fontfaces. When choosing the face, I was paying close attention to how the headline for the poster would look. It needed to feel concrete, assertive, bold, and most importantly, easy on the eyes to read.

The fontface found and discovered for the large, headline type and the main font for the campaign is Urbane by Rian Hughes from Device Fonts. The description says it is a classic, clear, and authorative sans, providing an even color in type. For the smaller, bodycopy, I paired it with Neuzeit Grotesk by URW Type Foundry. It has a slightly smaller character width and x-height than Urbane's wide and tall characters. It is geometric in shape, but is less autorative in it's feeling. Personally, I feel it's more suited to bodycopy type for this, especially with Urbane. The two together provide a nice contrast and easy readability.



The color used in designs is color picked from the orange gloves in one image. It was then darkened to make the text readable.



Here is the first round with content.

1991: Grand Rapids, MN 1973: Argyle, MN 2010: Marshall, MI 4 million gallons of crude oil. Spilled.

These are Enbridge's biggest failures. The top three largest land oil spills in United States history.

Committed by a Canadian company who mostly service the midwest region, Canada, and foreign markets. In the past 40 years, over eight million gallons have spilled.

Let's get rid of foreign big oil companies who cause millions in oil clean-up, destruction of watersheds, and who only care about money. Contact your local officials - Congress, General Assembly, Governor, and state departments. Write a letter. Tell them to demand that crude oil is not pumped through your state, especially if the company is Enbridge.




















Line 3 is operational. Enbridge got what they wanted – here's why we should never allow them another. Enbridge is responsible for the largest land oil spills in US history.

Why are they still in operation in the US?

What's happening?

In 1968, Enbridge (Interprovincial Pipeline Company) built Line 3 in Minnesota through Native lands, likely with already corroded pipes from leaving them in the elements for over six months, before construction. From the 1970s to 1991, it suffered 24 leaks due to the same same failure and 16 "large oil spills" which resulted in four million gallons spilled. It's been estimated that Line 3 is responsible for 5.7 million gallons spilled from 1971-1992 by the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency. A revised route was proposed in 2014 and it became operational on October 2nd, 2021 despite litigation and massive protests from indigenous communities and their allies. It transports tar sands and crude oil, the dirtiest oil that can be transported and used.





Enbridge is a Candian pipeline company who primarily deals in crude oil and natural gas pipelines. They are the reason for the three largest land oil spills in U.S. history.

The three spills equal four million gallons of crude oil spilled altogether.

In the past 47 years, they have had at least 927 leaks on their pipelines. These leaks and spills negatively affect indigenous communities. It's a question of when, not if, the next spill will happen.

The spills and construction often destroy wild rice fields and hunting grounds. These lands are protected by treaties with Native tribes.

The Polaris Institute found that from 1991-2010 there were 804 leaks from Enbridge.

In 1973, Line 3 spilled 1.3 million gallons near Argyle, Minnesota. That is everything known about this crude oil spill. There is little information about it available.

This spill is only ever seen when listed with the other largest spills. Research so far only says how much was spilled and where it happened.

In 1991, Line 3 spilled 1.7 million gallons into the Prairie River. The Mississippi River was two miles downstream and was saved by frozen water. Operators violated policies during the spill.

Enbridge operators shut the line down 71 minutes after they finally noticed the change in oil pressure at a quarter past noon. The spill happened earlier in the morning. In 2010, Line 6B ruptured, spilling one million gallons into the Kalamazoo River near Marshall, Michigan. Clean-up took five years. Line 6B has been replaced in its entirety and is named Line 78 now.

In 2021, Gov. Whitmer issued a shut down order by May 12, 2021 to Enbridge's Line 5 which lies under the Straits of Mackinac. It has been operating illegally for over 150 days. Currently, there are protests against the Line 3 Replacement Project in Minnesota. Enbridge replaced the existing 34-inch wide pipe from the 60s, with a new pipe 36 inches wide.

It can now pump much more oil than it did before. It has been renamed as Line 93, so it was never a replacement. It became fully operational in October 2021 despite years of protest. Much of this information is from Stop Line 3, Honor the Earth, and other organizations dedicated to stopping Enbridge pipelines. Information about recent spills and leaks are from their Community Saftey Reports.

These reports are not easily found on their website. Past reports are found by searching for them individually. The information also seems to contradict each other with different spill totals. Take the time to read about Enbridge and their pipeline tradegies from these organizations: Stop Line 3, Honor the Earth, Line 9 Communities, Oil & Water Don't Mix, FLOW, and MN350. Do your research.

Don't let your home be the next headline for a crude oil disaster.
